## Introducing The 1846 Society

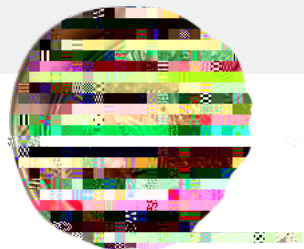

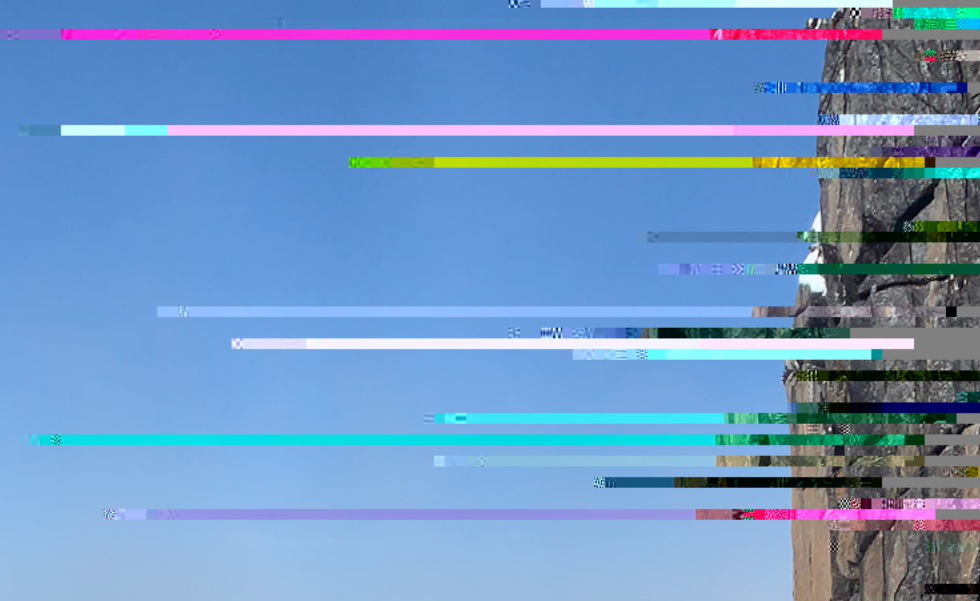

With the School's 175th anniversary in 2021, acknowledging the generosity and impact of past bequestors becomes particularly meaningful.





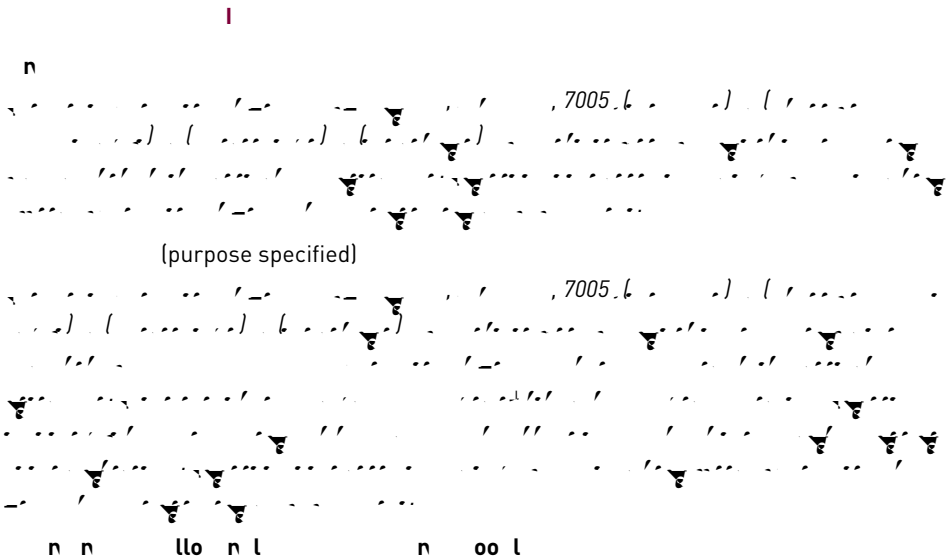




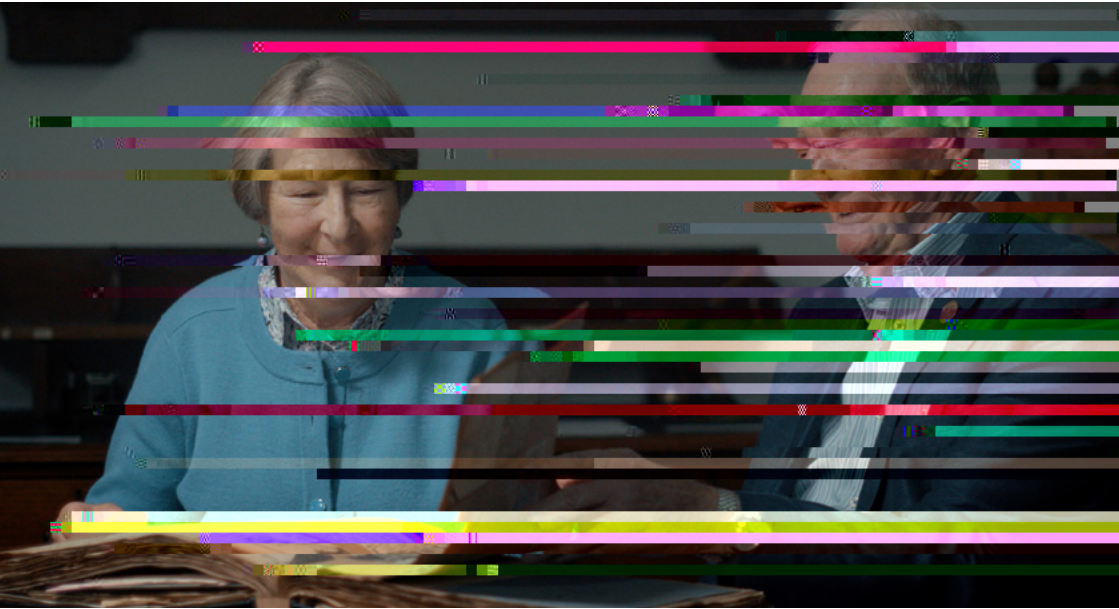
# Leaving a gift-in-will is simple.

You can include a bequest to The Hutchins School when you write your will. Bequests to Hutchins are received as gifts to the Building Fund, specific educational programs, the Endowment Fund or scholarships. Gifts-in-wills play a significant role in the development of the School, and may be a share of an estate, cash, items of personal property or real estate.

Bequests can be tied to benefit a specific program such as an academic discipline, building project or scholarship, or you can allow Hutchins to use bequests untied, in areas of greatest need.



If you already have a will, you can add a codicil (a legal provision) to include a bequest. Your legal advisor can add this amendment to your will. This codicil will include the date of the existing will, the date of the amendment and a statement outlining your wishes.

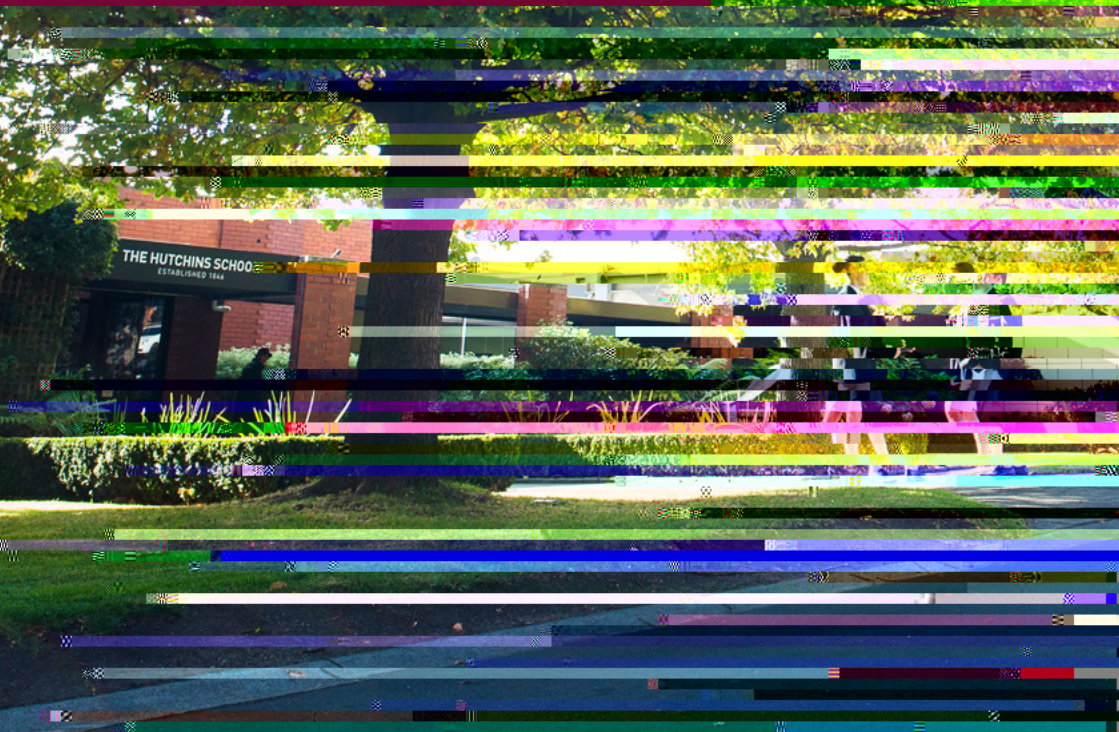
